Transfer Student Responsibilities

- A. To qualify for the Transfer Admissions Guarantee, active RMU students must submit an application for admission to The Chicago School, and shall be subject to the admission requirements of the specific degree program for which they wish to transfer.
- 1. PhD in Business Psychology ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

PhD in Business Psychology program applicants fulfill the admissions requirements by meeting the following criteria:

Will have completed a minimum of 152 quarter hour credits towards their Bachelors of Business Administration Degree (completed residency of 4 quarters and 48 hours is required) by the time they enter TCSPP's PhD program. Completed coursework must include a grade of "C" or higher in the following courses:

- 1. Organizational Behavior (MGT 340 at RMU or equivalent course)
- 2. Statistics (MAT 320 or MAT 330 at RMU, or equivalent course)
- 3. General Psychology Course (SSC 120 at RMU or equivalent course)
- a. Earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 from RMU.
- b. GRE with a cumulative score of at least 290.
- c. Students will complete final 36 quarter hours (24 semester hours) of BBA degree as Ph.D. in Business Psychology courses. Course will replace concentration and elective courses in RMU's BBA program.
 - 1. TCSPP will notify RMU once 24 semester hours (36 quarter hours) of PhD coursework had been completed.
 - 2. RMU will confer the Bachelor of Business Administration degree without a concentration once student has completed the required 24 semester hours (36 quarter hours) at TCSPP.

- B. All RMU students who enroll in The Chicago School shall be held to all academic policies as outlined in The Chicago School Student Handbook and The Chicago School Student Catalog. This includes, but is not limited to, completion of all graduation requirements for degree conferral.
- C. All RMU students who enroll in The Chicago School through this agreement will enter as Business Psychology PhD students and will be eligible for financial aid for the degree sought in their individual programs at The Chicago School.
