

I. Articulation Agreement between

a. MA in International Psychology (MA IP) and PhD in International Psychology (PhD IP)

II. Statement of Purpose

a. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate credit articulation and provide a smooth transition from one related degree program to another. It is further recognized that the attached Appendix A shall describe the approved courses and the admissions eligibility. This agreement identifies MA IP courses that are equivalent and replaceable in the PhD IP program.

III. Terms and Conditions of Credit Transfer and/or degree:

a. The evaluation and transfer of earned credits and/or degree credits shall be in full compliance with institutional policies and all other state and Federal education policies pertaining to credit transfer. Students will be subject to the required admissions requirements of the PhD IP program.

IV. Length of the Agreement

- a. This agreement shall be valid until May 31, 2021. Thereafter, the Agreement will be reevaluated for renewal.
- b. Either party may terminate this agreement but will need to work with institutional timelines for change (catalog publication).

V. Details of Publication of Agreement

a. This information will need to reside in the Academic Catalog. Publication is required to include the process for articulation to another degree program, the specific courses, and admission eligibility requirements.

Enrollment in Doctoral Level Courses

- Student must be accepted into the Doctoral degree under the terms of this agreement before enrolling in master's level courses.
- MA IP students seeking early entry into the PhD IP program will:
 - Be interviewed by a member of the PhD International Psychology Faculty Admissions Committee
 - Complete a two-page essay answering the following:



- How will your personal and professional accomplishments, academic background, and experience to date, contribute to your success in this Program?
- How will the successful completion of this Program support your professional career goals?
- Have at least a 3.0 Cumulative GPA
- Conferral of the MA International Psychology degree will require a total of 36 credit hours. Up to 12 credit hours may be applied from the PhD IP program per Appendix A. Student must apply for degree conferral once the graduation requirements are met. The standard degree conferral fee will apply.
- Doctoral Degree courses taken while a student in the MA program will count toward the graduation requirements of both programs (MA and PhD).

Tuition

• Students will pay the alumni tuition rate for PhD IP courses while enrolled in the MA IP program.
