

Internal Articulation Agreement

I. **Articulation Agreement Between:**

- a. TCSPP MA Applied Behavior Analysis (MA ABA) and MS Applied Behavior Analysis (MS ABA).

II. **Statement of Purpose:**

- a. This agreement between the MA ABA and MS ABA programs is intended to facilitate credit articulation and provide a smooth transition from one related degree program to another.
- b. This agreement allows qualifying MS ABA students to apply to the MA ABA program and be considered for acceptance if all admissions requirements are met. This agreement further allows MA ABA students to apply to the MS ABA program and be considered for acceptance if all admissions requirements are met.
- c. Students will be allowed to transfer in a maximum of 10 courses (28 credit hours) into the entering program from the exiting program. This agreement identifies all equivalent courses.

III. **Terms and Conditions of Credit Transfer and/or Degree:**

- a. The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits and/or degree credits shall be in full compliance with TCSPP institutional policies and all other state and federal education policies pertaining to credit transfer. Program specific requirements and/or required courses/degree are listed and defined below in this agreement. Students will be subject to the admissions requirements of the Master's Degree program they wish to enter into as stated in the current Academic Catalog.
- b. Students must apply to the MS ABA or MA ABA program under the terms of this agreement and be accepted in order for this agreement to apply.

IV. **Length of the Agreement:**

- a. This agreement shall be valid until (May 31, 2024). Thereafter, the agreement will be re-evaluated for renewal.
- b. Either party may terminate this agreement in accordance with institutional timelines for change (e.g., publication of the Academic Catalog). If one campus terminates the agreement, other campuses may continue adhering to this articulation agreement.

V. **Details of Publication of Agreement:**

- a. This information will reside in the Academic Catalog. Publication is required to include the process for articulation to another degree program, the specific courses, and the admission eligibility requirements.
- b. Program modifications affecting either program involved in this agreement may require re-evaluation and/or amendment of Appendix A subsequent to implementation.
