

### I. Articulation Agreement between

a. TCSPP EdS School Psychology and PsyD School Psychology

### II. Statement of Purpose

a. This agreement between the EdS and PsyD School Psychology programs is intended to facilitate credit articulation and provide a smooth transition from one related degree program to another. The agreement allows students to transfer credits earned in the EdS School Psychology to the PsyD School Psychology program. Eligible courses are identified in Appendix A. This agreement identifies the required and equivalent courses, as well as admissions requirements.

### III. Terms and Conditions of Credit Transfer and/or Degree

a. The evaluation and transfer of earned credits shall be in full compliance with institutional policies and all other state and Federal education policies pertaining to credit transfer. Program specific requirements and/or required courses/degree are listed and defined in Appendix A of this agreement. Students will be subject to the admissions requirements of the PsyD School Psychology program.

### IV. Length of the Agreement

- a. This agreement shall be valid until (May 31, 2023). Thereafter, the Agreement will be reevaluated for renewal.
- b. Either party may terminate this agreement, but will need to work with institutional timelines for change (e.g., catalog publication).

### V. Details of Publication of Agreement

- a. This information will need to reside in the Academic Catalog. Publication is required to include the process for articulation to another degree program, the specific courses, and the admission eligibility requirements.
- b. Program Modifications affecting either program involved in this agreement may require re-evaluation and/or amendment of Appendix A subsequent to implementation.

## Student Eligibility for Transferring EdS School Psychology program credits to the PsyD School Psychology program

- If accepted into the PsyD School Psychology program, students may transfer up to 64 total credits from the EdS School Psychology program. Eligible courses are identified in Appendix A.
- To count for transfer, the EdS courses must be no more than seven years old from date of completion to date of acceptance into the PsyD program.
- Students may apply for admission into the PsyD School Psychology program at any point while enrolled in or after completing the EdS School Psychology Program, and consistent with the PsyD program's admissions and start schedule.
- Applicants for admission to the PsyD School Psychology program must meet the posted admission requirement in the current Academic Catalog.

### **Enrollment in the PsyD School Psychology**

Student must be accepted into the PsyD School Psychology program under the terms of this agreement for the associated credits to apply to the PsyD degree.

 Up to 64 credit hours may be applied to the PsyD degree from the EdS School Psychology program per Appendix A.
