



Internal Articulation Agreement

I. Articulation Agreement Between:

- a. The Chicago School BA Psychology and Master of Public Health

I. Statement of Purpose:

- a. This agreement between the BA Psychology and MA Public Health Psychology programs is intended to facilitate credit articulation and provide a smooth transition from one related degree program (BA) to another (MA).
- b. This agreement allows qualifying THE CHICAGO SCHOOL BA PSYCHOLOGY students in their final year of study to apply to the MA Public Health Psychology program and be considered for acceptance if all admissions requirements are met.
- c. Students will be allowed to take courses outlined in Appendix A in lieu of BA PSYCHOLOGY Concentration Courses, and have them count toward degree completion of the MA Public Health program, thus reducing time to completion of the MA Public Health degree. It is further recognized that Appendix A shall describe the approved courses and this agreement shall describe the admissions eligibility. This agreement identifies all required and equivalent courses.

II. Terms and Conditions of Credit Transfer and/or Degree:

- a. The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits and/or degree credits shall be in full compliance with THE CHICAGO SCHOOL institutional policies and all other state and federal education policies pertaining to credit transfer. Program specific requirements and/or required courses/degree are listed and defined below in this agreement. Students will be subject to the admissions requirements of the MA Public Health program as stated below in this agreement, which may include requirements above and beyond those that have already completed a bachelor's degree from an institutionally accredited institution.
- b. Students must apply to the MA Public Health Psychology program under the terms of this agreement and be accepted in order for this agreement to apply.

III. Length of the Agreement:



- a. This agreement shall be valid until (December 31, 2027). Thereafter, the agreement will be re-evaluated for renewal.
- b. Either party may terminate this agreement in accordance with institutional timelines for change (e.g., publication of the Academic Catalog). If one campus terminates the agreement, other campuses may continue adhering to this articulation agreement.

II. Details of Publication of Agreement

- a. The details of this agreement will reside in the institution's Academic Catalog, and will include the process for articulation to another degree program, the specific courses, and the admission eligibility requirements.
- b. Program modifications affecting either program involved in this agreement may require re-evaluation and/or amendment of Appendix A subsequent to implementation.

VI. Early Acceptance into Master of Public Health

- a. Student must have completed at least 87 credit hours in BA Psychology to qualify for early admission to Master of Public Health under this agreement.
- b. In addition to the above requirement, student must also:
 - i. Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
 - ii. Meet professional comportment guidelines set forth in the Student Handbook and have no pending referrals to the Student Affairs Committee.

VII. Automatic Acceptance into Master of Public Health

- a. Students completing the master's level courses listed below in Appendix A with a B- or higher on the first attempt will be auto-admitted to the Master of Public Health master's program as long as all other admission requirements have been met (to include Criminal Background Check if applicable).
- b. Master's degree courses taken by a student enrolled in a bachelor's degree program may count toward the graduation requirements of both programs (BA and MPH) provided the grade received for the master's



level course is a B- or higher (as required by THE CHICAGO SCHOOL Academic Grade Policy for graduate degrees). Students who earn a grade below a B- on a master's degree course that meets THE CHICAGO SCHOOL requirements of THE CHICAGO SCHOOL Academic Grade Policy for a passing grade in an undergraduate course will have the course counted toward the bachelor's degree. For courses with a grade lower than B-, the student will be required to retake the course for master's degree level credit once enrolled the master's degree program. Master's degree courses are graded according to THE CHICAGO SCHOOL graduate level grading policy.

- c. BA Psychology students qualifying to enroll in Master of Public Health courses under this agreement may enroll in some or all of the courses listed in the Appendix A Program Articulation Table.

VIII. Enrollment in Master's Level Courses

- a. Student must be accepted into Master of Public Health under the terms of this agreement before enrolling in Master of Public Health courses.
- b. Conferral of BA Psychology will require a total of 120 credit hours. Up to 6 credit hours may be applied from Master of Public Health per Appendix A. Student must apply for degree conferral once the graduation requirements are met. The standard degree conferral fee will apply.
- c. Master of Public Health courses taken while a student in BA Psychology will count toward the graduation requirements of both programs, given grade requirements are met for graduate level courses.

IX. Tuition

- a. Students enrolled in Master of Public Health courses under this agreement will pay the BA Psychology tuition rate for Master of Public Health courses while enrolled in BA Psychology.

X. Appendix A

- a. The following Program Articulation Table contains all academic details of courses and/or degree that are qualified for credit transfer under this agreement.
