Student Eligibility for Taking the Advanced Courses:

- Graduate Certificate in Applied Behavior Analysis GPA must be 3.0 or higher, each individual class must have been passes with a B- or higher
- Student must have completed these courses within the five-year period prior to admission to MS ABA

- Student must be admitted to MS ABA prior to award of transfer credit.
